What will I learn?
<p>Component 1 Physical Geography</p> <p>Topics covered: Water and Carbon Cycles, Coastal Systems and Landscapes and Ecosystems under stress</p> <p>Component 2 Human Geography</p> <p>Topics covered: Global Systems and Global Governance, Changing Places, Contemporary Urban Environments</p> <p>Component 3 Geographical Investigation</p> <p>Students will undertake fieldwork during the course. These will be on both human and physical geography topics. At least 4 days of fieldwork will take place during the course. They will collect, record and analyse data in order to examine hypotheses.</p> <p>An individual investigation of 3000 to 4000 words will then take place.</p> <p>The assignment will count for 20% of the overall 'A' level mark.</p>
How will I be assessed?
<p>Question types include multiple choice, short answer and extended written answers.</p> <p>There will be 2 x 2.5 hour examinations counting for 80% of the total marks.</p>
Is there anything else I need to know?
<p>Must meet the standard A Level entry requirements for the 6th form.</p>
Future Opportunities?
<p>Continue to study Geography at University to degree level.</p> <p>The skills you will acquire on this course, such as ICT, graphical and mathematical enquiry, planning and map work, are also useful for most jobs and university courses.</p> <p>Previous students have gone on to employment in the fields of town planning, work with the environment agency, renewable energy, education, tourism and surveying.</p>
