**Government School Census Day/School Meal Day**

The next School Census falls on **Thursday 3rd October 2019.**

The information we provide on the day dictates the *amount of funding* we receive in our next school budget.

If you think you may be eligible for free school meals, please contact the East Riding of Yorkshire Council’s Benefits section on (01482) 394799.

They will need the following information from you to process your application:

- Your name
- Your date of birth
- National Insurance Number (or registered asylum seekers number)
- Child's details - Name, date of birth and school.

The benefits section will make automated checks to confirm your entitlement and tell you immediately if you qualify.

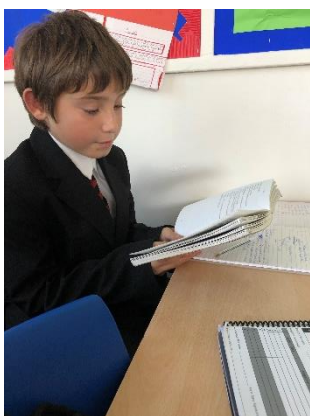
Please then call the schools Main Reception on 01262 676198 and ask to speak to the schools Support Services Assistant, Mrs Barker, who will ensure your child's free school meal entitlement is processed within school. Or email [admin@headlandsschool.co.uk](mailto:admin@headlandsschool.co.uk) stating your child's name.

The number of school meals we serve on the day also has an impact on the budget. We would therefore like to invite *all children* to stay for a school meal on Thursday 3rd October 2019.



Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment every day not only perform better in reading tests than those who don't, but also develop a broader vocabulary, increased general knowledge and a better understanding of other cultures.

In fact, reading for pleasure is more likely to determine whether a child does well at school than their social or economic background. Here at Headlands School students enjoy reading on a daily basis during Tutor Time. Take 5 minutes to ask your child(ren) what they are reading and what the book is about. This will help reinforce to your child just how important reading is in our daily lives.
