



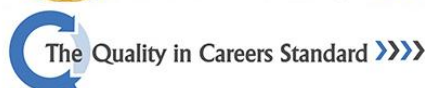

<p>The course is for students who wish to continue their academic study of physical education following on from Btec level 2 whilst also studying 2 other A levels or for students who have a passion for Science and its application to sport.</p>

How you'll learn:

You will be taught through classroom presentations that look in depth at the topics covered during each unit. You will also have the opportunity to put theory into practice using the fitness suite and completing a 30hr work placement in the sports industry.

What you need to bring:

Basic Equipment, Practical Kit

How you'll be assessed:

Unit 1- Students will complete a 1.5 hour, 80 marks, written examination set and marked by Pearson

Unit 2- Students will complete a task set and marked by Pearson and completed under supervised conditions. This is split into Part A and Part B. In Part A learners will be given a case study one week before a supervised assessment period in order to carry out preparation. In Part B, the supervised assessment period is 2.5 hours as timetabled by Pearson. A written training plan is submitted worth 60 marks.

Unit 3- Students will be assessed internally using a range of methods such as written reports, oral presentations and recorded interviews. Students also need to complete a 30hr work placement.

Unit 6- Students will be assessed internally using a range of methods such as written reports, oral presentations and recorded interviews.

Where next:

Aims and learning outcomes This course will prepare learners for the further study of PE or sports science courses as well as other related subject areas such as psychology, sociology and biology. Learners will also develop the transferable skills that are in demand by further education, Higher Education and employers in all sectors of industry allowing them to access a paid job or apprenticeship.
